What is Sexting?

When people talk about sexting they usually mean sending and receiving:

- naked pictures or 'nudes'
- 'underwear shots'
- sexual or 'dirty pics'
- rude text messages or videos

They can be sent from a friend, boyfriend, girlfriend or someone you've met online.

Sexting can easily happen. Things can go wrong-even when you didn't mean for them to.

What you need to know about sexting

- It's against the law to possess or distribute sexual images.
- Once you send a message you can't control what happens to it.
- Don't let someone guilt or pressure you into sexting.
- If you've sent a nude pic, have an honest conversation with the person you sent it to and ask them to delete it.
- If an indecent or nude pic of you is posted online, you can contact the website directly about having it removed
